1. Word – Abject

Part of Speech – Adjective
Definition – Sunk to a low condition or in miserable circumstances
Sentence – The man stood staring at the monster in abject terror
Synonym – Wretched, degraded
Antonym – Excellent, worthy

**2. Word –** Ambivalence

Part of Speech – Noun

**Definition – Mixed feelings or emotions** 

**Sentence** – The man held a sense of ambivalence to the new changes taking place.

Synonym – Doubt, hesitancy, uncertainty

Antonym – Certainty, sureness

**3. Word –** Balatron

Part of Speech – Noun
Definition – A Clown; One who speaks nonsense
Sentence – Who's this Balatron?
Synonym – Clown, fool, buffoon
Antonym – Any person who could be considered eloquent, or well put together.

4. Word – Bizarre

Part of Speech – Adjective
Definition – Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual
Sentence – What a bizarre dance that man is doing. He must be insane.
Synonym – Comical, curious, extraordinary, freakish, grotesque
Antonym – Common, normal

5. Word – Disdain

Part of Speech – Noun
Definition – Lack of respect accompanied by a feeling of intense dislike
Sentence – She had a strong feeling of disdain for the color yellow.
Synonym – Contempt, derision
Antonym – Admiration, affection

6. Word – Ergo

Part of Speech – Conjunction, Adverb
Definition – Therefore; hence
Sentence – There were no more cookies, ergo the child was angry.
Synonym – Accordingly, consequently
Antonym –

7. Word – Fathom

Part of Speech – Verb
Definition – To penetrate the meaning of; to comprehend; to understand
Sentence – I cannot fathom why people don't turn in their word packets.
They are literally the easiest 40 points to get in my class.
Synonym – Comprehend, figure out, grasp
Antonym – Misunderstand, misinterpret

- 8. Word Genre
  - Part of Speech Noun

**Definition** – A class of art having a characteristic form or technique; a kind of literary or artistic work

**Sentence** – My favorite genre of literature is anthropomorphic-teen-

paranormal-investigative-dystopian-romance. You probably haven't heard of it.

**Synonym** – Category, style, fashion **Antonym** –

9. Word – Hypocritical

Part of Speech – Adjective
Definition – Professing feelings or virtues one does not have
Sentence – If Mr. Gowers said he didn't swear that would be hypocritical.
Synonym – Deceptive, false, contradictory
Antonym – Genuine

**10.** Word – Idealism

Part of Speech – Noun

**Definition –** A fantasy view of a situation

**Sentence** – The idealism he has that everything is perfect is going to hurt him later.

Synonym – Idealization, false-hope

**Antonym** – Truth, realism

**11. Word** – Lackadaisical

Part of Speech – Adjective
Definition – Idle, especially in a dreamy way; lacking spirit liveliness
Sentence – Sloths could be considered to be lackadaisical.
Synonym – Apathetic, half-hearted, lazy
Antonym – Active, energetic

**12.** Word – Mettle

Part of Speech – Noun

**Definition** – The courage to carry on

**Sentence** – Though he had been thoroughly beaten, he had the mettle to fight on.

Synonym – Bravery, caliber, courage

Antonym – Cowardice, weakness

**13.** Word – Motley

Part of Speech – Adjective
Definition – Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds.
Sentence – What makes Early Light so charming is the motley crew of teachers and students that work/go there.
Synonym – Assorted, mingled
Antonym – Same, similar

- **14.** Word Odyssey
  - Part of Speech Noun

Definition – A long, wandering, and eventful journey

**Sentence** – The sequence of events that got me teaching at Early Light was quite the odyssey.

Synonym – Adventure, excursion

Antonym –

**15.** Word – Perfidy

Part of Speech – Noun
Definition – Betrayal of trust; an act of deliberate betrayal
Sentence – The assassination of Caesar was a deliberate perfidy.
Synonym – Betrayal, corruption
Antonym – Faithfulness, fidelity

16. Word – Petulant
Part of Speech – Adjective
Definition – Easily irritated or annoyed
Sentence – Petulant children make me petulant.
Synonym – Cranky, impatient
Antonym – Cheerful, happy

17. Word – Querulous
Part of Speech – Adjective
Definition – Habitually complaining
Sentence – We all have that one friend that is querulous. (Hint: you may be that friend.)
Synonym – Bemoaning, whiny
Antonym – Easy-going, cheerful

- **18.** Word Somber
  - Part of Speech Adjective

**Definition –** Grave or even gloomy in character; lacking brightness or color; dull

**Sentence** – Edgar Allen Poe was a somber man, writing the most somber stories, in his somber life.

Synonym – Bleak, dark, dull

Antonym – Bright, exciting

**19.** Word – Tangent

Part of Speech - Noun

**Definition –** Often unrelated

Sentence – Mr. Gowers will occasionally start to get on a tangent during class, distracting both himself and others. He will not apologize for it.
Synonym – Departure, digression

Antonym – On topic

**20. Word –** Zest

Part of Speech – Noun
Definition – Vigorous and enthusiastic enjoyment
Sentence – Zest is the only thing I wish for you in your life.

Synonym – Enthusiasm, passion

Antonym – Apathy, discontent
